## EXCEPTIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

- IPC is what should be considered "regular" science. Honors Biology is advanced
- Students must take 2 years of the same foreign language to graduate.
- Fine Art choices: Art, Theater Arts, Band, Music Theory, Jazz Band or Floral Design
- If your student is taking Algebra I in 8th grade, \& will pass it for the year, they can choose between Honors Geometry or Geometry.

- If your student is taking Spanish I in 8th grade, \& will pass it for the year, they will take Spanish 2 in 9 th grade.


## EXCEPTIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

- Students have to wait to take Intro to Welding starting with their IOth grade year- per the welding teacher, Mr. Jones
- One of the following sports is required to be in Boys Athletics for 9th grade: Football, Basketball, Golf or Soccer- per our coaches
- One of the following sports is required to be in Girls Athletics for 9th grade: Volleyball, Basketball, Golf, Soccer or Softball- per our coaches
- Boys cannot join athletics for baseball till starting with their IOth grade year- per the baseball coach. (No freshmen boys are allowed in athletics for ONLY baseball.)
- All other sports are after school only; meaning they cannot join athletics for any sports than what is listed above- per our coaches


## EXPLANATION OF REGULAR, HONORS AND AP

- If a student takes a regular class and makes a 70 , they get a 70 on their report card, a 70 for their GPA and a 70 for ranking.
- If a student takes an Honors class and makes a 70, they get a 70 on their report card, a 70 for their GPA and a 75 for ranking.
- If a student takes an AP class and makes a 70, they get a 70 on their report card, a 70 for their GPA and an 80 for ranking.


## SCENARIO

- Jane takes Honors English and makes an 80.
- Joe takes regular English and makes a 90.
- Who is better off when looking at grades? ranking?
- Jane has an 80 on report card, 80 for GPA and 85 for ranking.
- Joe has 90, 90, and 90 for the 3.
- You have to decide what is most important - grades? Rank? Taking advanced classes?

Successfully complete:

- a total of 4 credits in math, which must include Algebra 2,
- a total of 4 credits in science,
- the remaining curriculum requirements and
- at least one endorsement
**** A student must earn distinguished level of achievement to be eligible for top 10\% automatic admission.

## SCHEDULE CHANGES

- Students can make as many schedule changes as they'd like from now till the last day of this school year- May 26
- Very limited schedule changes are allowed the first week of school
- Schedule changes out of Honors/AP classes are allowed till the Friday after the first progress report with signed parent permission


## GRADING PERIODS

- 4 nine weeks- 1 st $\& 2$ nd in the 1 st semester $\& 3$ rd $\&$ 4 th in the 2 nd semester
- 1st semester ends at Christmas break \& 2nd semester ends at the end of school
- GPA \& Class Rank are ONLY ran at the end of each semester
- Progress Reports are twice in each nine weeks; at the end of the first 3 weeks $\&$ at 6 weeks


## ZAP

## (Zeros Aren't Permitted)

- The Saturday following a progress report from 8 AM to 10 AM.
- Students can make up zeros on daily work (excluding quizzes, tests $\&$ projects) within the 3 weeks prior.
- Student must be on time (8:00 am)
- Student must stay the full time (10:00am)
- Student must remain working the entire time
- Student must be in dress code with their ID!!


## Zap Schedule

 TBA- Student must bring everything needed to complete assignments (books, paper, pens, calculator)


## ATTENDANCE

- You have to attend school $90 \%$ of each semester in order to receive credit for all your classes.
- There are 82 days in our first semester $\& 89$ days in our second semester.
- $10 \%$ includes both excused $\&$ unexcused absences.
- After missing more than $10 \%$, you will have to make-up hours.
- Our attendance clerk or Assistant Principal will get with you about make-up hours, when needed.
