



Where do students report in the morning?


- 1st period class when they arrive on campus

Chromebook Basic Information

- Chromebook rollout within the 1st 3 weeks of school.*
 - Brand New Chromebooks this year.
- Expected to bring CB to school, charged, ready for use.
 - Ask that no stickers or markings be placed on the CB.

Chromebook Insurance

- Insurance cost \$30*
- Covers 1st accidental damage
- Covers theft (except from unattended vehicles)
Police report must be filed.
- Will not cover intentional damage or lost
- Will not cover cost of charger. Replacement cost is
\$35.00

Attendance for Credit

- To receive credit in a class, a student must attend 90% of the days the class is offered.
- If a student attends fewer than 90% of the days offered, they will be referred to the Attendance Review Committee.
 - Students with doctor's excuses still must meet the 90% rule.
 - Failure to attain the 90 percent standard will result in the student being obligated to make up the time.
- Multiple opportunities will be made available for students to make up time.
- Retention is possible for excessive absences.

Compulsory Attendance

A court of law may impose penalties against both the student and his or her parents if a school-aged student is not attending school. A complaint against the parent may be filed in court if the student:

- is absent from school ten or more days or parts of days within a six month period (a semester) in the same school year,
- or, is absent on three or more days or parts of days within a four week period.

Dress Code

- Underclothes must be worn and NOT shown.
- Hair must be neat, clean and NOT cover the eyes. Spiked hair will NOT be allowed in excess of 2" in length. Mohawks/faux hawks will NOT be allowed. Well-trimmed sideburns are permissible and must NOT be lower than the ear lobe. Facial hair is NOT permitted at the elementary schools and Henderson Middle School but is permitted at the high school if neatly trimmed and groomed. No offensive lines or designs in hair.
- Hair should not be painted, colored, dyed, or streaked with unnatural colors.
- Appropriate footwear must be worn. No house shoes or slippers may be worn.
- No tight or revealing clothing of any kind. No yoga or jazz pants.
- No tank shirts, muscle shirts, or bare midriffs. All shirts must have a sleeve.

Dress Code

- Shorts are permitted. Shorts must be an appropriate length. Shorts and pants must be worn at the waistline. No sagging or excessively baggy pants. Underclothing is not to show at any time. Pant pockets must be on the buttocks.
- Shorts, pants or jeans may not have holes of any kind, including strings or frays, regardless if shorts are underneath.
- Warm-up suits, sweat suits, and physical education apparel are NOT appropriate for outside the physical education areas.
- Pajamas (tops or pants) are NOT allowed.
- Hoodies, hats, caps, headphones and sunglasses may not be worn at school at any time during the school day. Hairnets, headbands and bandanas are not allowed.
- No large chains or accessories.
- Body piercing jewelry of any kind is NOT allowed at any time. Males may not wear earrings.
- No gang related apparel (hats, headgear, chains, bandannas, spiked accessories etc.)
- No cosmetic dental devices.

School ID's

- School IDs do not need to be worn all of that time; however, you must have your ID to purchase food inside of the cafeteria.
- The school will supply the 1st one; however, you are responsible for purchasing the others.
- IDs & lanyards can be purchased in the front office

ZAP

- The ZAP (Zeroes Aren't Permitted) Program is an additional opportunity for students to make up zeroes on daily work.
- Zeroes must be made up within 3 weeks of receiving a failing grade.
- ZAP will be scheduled on Saturday morning and students will be required to wear their ID, be in full compliance with dress code, and on time to attend.
 - Gates locked at 8:00 and no others will be admitted for safety purposes.
 - 8:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.



ZAP RULES

- No eating, drinking, or talking
